4 GENERAL ORDER RE: IMPLEMENTATION OF EMERGENCY RELIEF  
5 AUTHORIZED PURSUANT TO GOVERNMENT CODE SECTION 68115 BY  
6 CHAIR OF JUDICIAL COUNCIL

8 On April 14, 2022, the Chief Justice of California and Chair of the Judicial  
9 Council ruled as follows:

10 Because of the COVID-19 pandemic, leading to health and safety  
11 concerns resulting in substantial operational impediments, and the  
12 proclamations of states of emergency by federal, state, and local  
13 officials, it was determined on 25 prior occasions that the conditions  
14 described in Government Code section 68115(a) were met with regard  
15 to the Superior Court of California, County of Merced (Court). Based  
16 on those determinations, and pursuant to the Court's requests,  
17 corresponding prior emergency orders issued, authorizing the Court to  
18 implement certain relief under Government Code section 68115.  
19 Upon the renewed request of Presiding Judge Mark V. Bacciarini, it is  
20 now determined that the conditions described in Government Code  
21 section 68115(a) continue to exist (Gov. Code, § 68115(c)), and it is  
22 ordered that the Court is authorized to do the following:

- 23 • Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and  
24 583.320 of the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to  
25 trial by not more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in  
26 which the deadline otherwise would expire from June 1, 2022  
27 to June 30, 2022 inclusive (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(6)); and
- 28 • Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal  
Code (section 1382) for the holding of a criminal trial by not  
more than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the  
original or previously extended statutory deadline otherwise  
would expire from April 16, 2022 to May 15, 2022, inclusive.  
(Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10).

1 This authority supplements the authority to extend section 1382  
2 deadlines previously granted in statewide emergency orders and  
3 emergency orders specific to the Court. Accordingly, for any case in  
4 which the time to bring a defendant to trial previously was extended  
5 under one or more of those prior emergency orders, and the extended  
6 deadline falls within the above-specified time period, this order  
7 authorizes the Court to extend the previously extended deadline by up  
8 to an additional 30 days. For any case in which the initial section  
9 1382 deadline falls within the above-specified time period and is not  
10 governed by a prior emergency order, this order authorizes the Court  
11 to extend the time to bring a defendant to trial by a total of up to 30  
12 days.

13 Accordingly, the Presiding Judge of the Merced Superior Court, hereby  
14 orders as follows:

15 The Judges of the Merced Superior Court are hereby authorized to:

- 16 1. Extend the time periods provided in sections 583.310 and 583.320 of  
17 the Code of Civil Procedure to bring an action to trial by not more  
18 than 30 days, applicable only to cases in which the deadline otherwise  
19 would expire from June 1, 2022 to June 30, 2022 inclusive (Gov.  
20 Code, § 68115(a)(6)); and
- 21 2. Extend the time period provided in section 1382 of the Penal Code  
22 (section 1382) for the holding of a criminal trial by not more than 30  
23 days, applicable only to cases in which the original or previously  
24 extended statutory deadline otherwise would expire from April 16,  
25 2022 to May 15, 2022, inclusive. (Gov. Code, § 68115(a)(10).

26 This authority supplements the authority to extend section 1382  
27 deadlines previously granted in statewide emergency orders and  
28 emergency orders specific to the Court. Accordingly, for any case in  
which the time to bring a defendant to trial previously was extended  
under one or more of those prior emergency orders, and the extended  
deadline falls within the above-specified time period, this order  
authorizes the Court to extend the previously extended deadline by up  
to an additional 30 days. For any case in which the initial section  
1382 deadline falls within the above-specified time period and is not

1 governed by a prior emergency order, this order authorizes the Court  
2 to extend the time to bring a defendant to trial by a total of up to 30  
3 days.

4 THIS ORDER IS EFFECTIVE IMMEDIATELY.
