20CV-03775 Gina Brotherton, et al. v. Chun Lui, et al.

Motion by Defendant Estate of Lui to Set Aside Entry of Default

The motion to set aside entry of default is GRANTED. Defendant has moved to set aside the default based on defective service of process. The Estate was not named in the complaint at the time of service on March 7, 2024, therefore the initial service of process was defective and the resulting default is procedurally void. Under Code of Civil Procedure section 473, subdivision (d), the entry of default is set aside as void for lack of jurisdiction.

Motion by Defendant Estate of Lui to Dismiss Case

The motion to dismiss Defendant Estate of Lui is DENIED. The defendant in this case passed away prior to the expiration of the normal limitations period, giving plaintiffs one year from that date to file the instant complaint under Probate Code section 551, on the condition that damages were limited to those within the coverage of the insurance policy. As defendant was deceased at the time of the filing of the original complaint on December 17, 2020, he was not amenable to service of process under Code of Civil Procedure section 583.240. The Court must exclude from the calculation for time for service that time during which the defendant was not amenable to the process of the court, and during which the estate had not been probated. (*Polony v. White* (1974) 43 Cal.App.3d 44, 48.)

24CV-03018 Francisco Ornelas v. David Chavez, et al.

Demurrer by Defendant Jose Leonel Guzman-Banuelos to First Amended Complaint's Second, Fifth, Sixth, and Seventh Causes of Action for Failure to State a Cause of Action and for Uncertainty

The demurrer to the second cause of action of the first amended complaint is SUSTAINED WITH LEAVE TO AMEND on the basis of uncertainty and failure to state a cause of action. Allegations of misconduct directed solely against one defendant do not state a cause of action against another defendant. (*Carter v. Prime Healthcare Paradise Valley LLC* (2011) 198 Cal.App.4th 396, 410.) The complaint fails to allege specific representations that are directly attributable to Defendant Guzman-Banuelos, rendering it uncertain as to what allegations he must respond to.

The demurrer to the fifth cause of action of the first amended complaint is SUSTAINED WITH LEAVE TO AMEND on the basis of failure to state a cause of action. When pleading defamation, the words constituting the alleged libel or slander must be specifically identified, if not pled verbatim, in the complaint. (*Des Granges v. Crall* (1915) 27 Cal.App. 303, 315.) Plaintiff fails to do so, nor does the complaint allege how any published statements were defamatory.

The demurrer to the sixth cause of action of the first amended complaint is SUSTAINED WITH LEAVE TO AMEND on the basis of failure to state a cause of action. When an action for libel is alleged, a false-light claim based on the same set of facts is superfluous and must be dismissed. (*Selleck v. Globe International, Inc.* (1985) 166 Cal.App.3d 1123, 1136.) Furthermore, as with the fifth cause of action, Plaintiff fails to provide specific details regarding the published documents, with the exception of a driver's license, or to plead how they were defamatory or place the plaintiff in a false light.

The demurrer to the seventh cause of action of the first amended complaint is OVERRULED. The Court finds that the complaint states facts sufficient to constitute a cause of action as to defendant, Guzman-Banuelos, for invasion of privacy.

Any amended complaint shall be filed no later than October 31, 2025.

24CV-05366 Michael Lewis v. VP Auto Repair

Order to Show Cause re: Dismissal
